

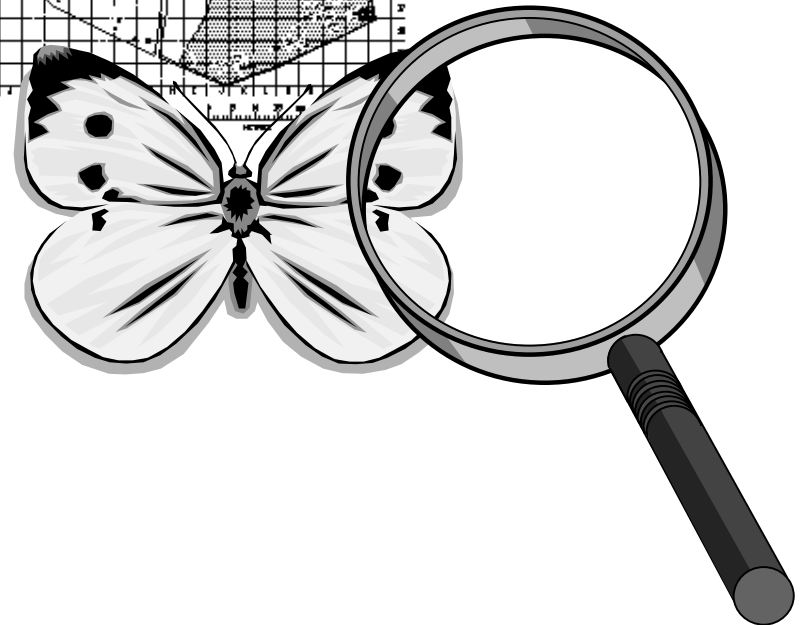
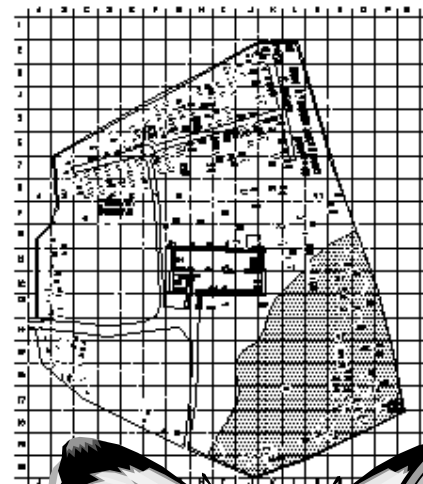
16. If you walk past the pine tree, at the back of the church you can see some bins. One bin has a sign on it that says for 'Green Waste'. What do you think green waste is?
